Thanks so much for your interest in our community.

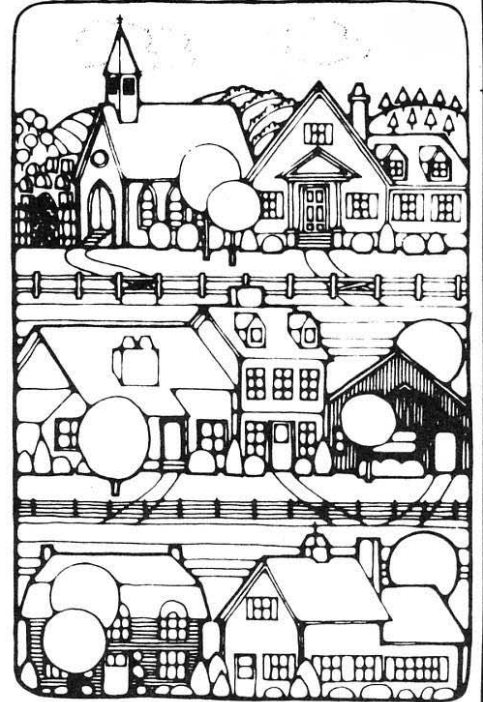

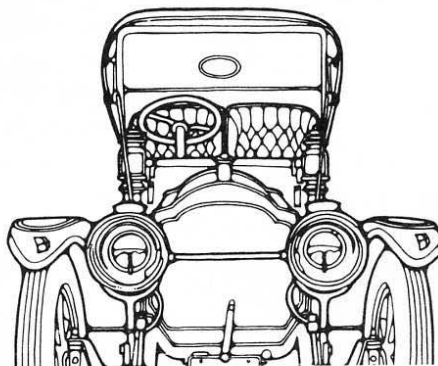
